Development plans around Civic Centre area moving forward

A plan that could result in almost 400 medium to high-density housing units being built on lands around the Halton Hills Civic Centre is in the home stretch.

The Civic Centre Area Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP), which indicates that 360 to 390 units in a mix of structures like townhomes and apartments could fit on property near the Maple Ave./Trafalgar Rd. intersection, is expected to go before council for approval in

A public open house is also being

planned for next month (date to be determined).

The plan has been in the works since 2013 and applies to the lands bounded by Maple Ave., Princess Anne Dr. and the CN railway. It s designed to help the Town meet its intensification objectives, which says there should be a total of 520 new residential units in the broader Civic Centre District that encompasses railway by 2031.

The property west of the tracks will be the subject of a future CDP.

To meet the intensification target, the CDP suggests a mix of

\$250,000 fire damage to Acton area home

Damage is estimated at \$250,000 following a fire in a rural residence near Acton Friday afternoon.

Morrison said the fire was difficult to battle initially as the home was under renovation and the smoke caused zero visibility until venting took place.
