

Smart Commute is a management program

that focuses on reducing traffic congestion, improving air quality, providing more sustainable travel options and reducing commuting

The Gold Workplace designation recognizes the Town as an outstanding workplace that demonstrates innovation, focuses on measuring successes and achieves significant positive outcomes when promoting alternate modes of transportation, other than single vehicle occupan-

As a leader in sustainability, in 2014, Town of Halton Hills Council put in place a flexible and innovative set of Green Development Stan-

The Standards are designed to maximize the many positive attributes that emanate from development while minimizing its potentially negative impacts.

This is being accomplished by improving energy and water efficiency, waste management, resource use and community design of new development.

To date, over 400 residential units and about 120,000-square-metres of non-residential development are in the process of implementing the Green Development Standards and

sustainable development features.

Recently I attended the annual fire department recognition night. It was very interesting to hear that they responded to 942 calls last year.

These calls consisted of 71 transportation demand RICK BONNETTE fires, 253 fire alarm activations, 101 carbon monoxide

alarms, 130 motor vehicle collisions and rescues, 100 medical public assists and 63 hazardous material incidents. It was an honour and pleasure to welcome our 13 new firefighters and congratulate the recipients of long service recognition.
