The couple were both in their final years at University of Guelph. Sutherland was a fourth-year commerce major, Firth an English major.

land, a number of local residents and friends stood behind the police barricades as Caledon OPP and Central Region diving teams worked diligently to break through the ice Monday.

Using ropes, pulleys, a chainsaw and at least two crew members in the water as well as two more on shore, they slowly managed to free the two kayaks early Monday afternoon as they continued their search.

It s not common to see kayakers around this time of year but it was just such a beautiful day yesterday, said longtime Terra Cotta resident, Jamie Bobechko. I ve just never seen anything like this happen in the 19 years we ve been here.

He added that given the warm temperatures over the last few months, the river, which is normally totally frozen over on the surface, had opened up significantly in terms of

While the waters appeared to be flowing rather freely everywhere else, this particular section still had significant ice cover despite the warm temperatures in recent days.
