Jack is so dynamic and offensively gifted, but also his competition level never stops. In his mind he's 6-foot-3 and he and Brendan have been great together. Jordan Crocker has really stepped up too to make up a great line.

FORMIDABLE FLYERS: Walters is wary of some of Orangeville's firepower up front, namely the club's top two scorers, Lucas Smilsky and Jack Jeffers, who was picked up from the Burlington Cougars midway through the season.

They've got some top-end guys so we

have to be aware of them, said Walters. Their goaltending is good and (Derek) Topatigh is one of the best defencemen in the league, so it's not going to be an easy series, that's for sure.

SOUTHERN EXPOSURE: Several U.S. citizens have pulled on a Raiders jersey over the years, but to the best of anyone's recollection around the team, none has come from the Sunshine State.

Walters acquired Floridian Bennett Altman late in the season and Georgetown is the Coral Springs native's third Canadian

tour stop this year after playing for Tier II clubs in the Ottawa area and Manitoba.

The 20-year-old forward has two assists in four games with the Raiders and looks to add some speed and scoring to the team's attack.

Altman grew up as a fan of the NHL's Florida Panthers and ECHL's Florida Everblades, holding season tickets for those teams, and plays pickup during the summer months with Philadelphia Flyers rookie-of-the-year candidate Shayne Gostisbehere.

People might be surprised but there are a lot of good hockey players down there and

a lot of them are coming up north to play, said the 5-foot-10, 165-pound Altman.

You're seeing more and more guys coming from uncommon hockey backgrounds like Florida or Auston Matthews from Arizona. Youth hockey is getting really popular in a lot of places now where you wouldn't expect it to be.
