D Entremont was involved with the Cancer Assistance Services of Halton Hills for 10 years, including as a Team Captain for April door-to-door canvassing in its April campaign. Kay also bakes cookies and squares for the families of cancer patients. She organizes the annual Victorian Tea and has helped raise over \$30,000 for Weekend to End Women s Cancers benefiting Princess Margaret Hospital. d Entremont has participated in the civic process by serving on the election campaign committees of David Kentner and Mark Rowe.

All this and more she does in a quiet, unassuming way. When contacted by the Lions Club, d Entremont said, I don t think I have done that much.

The selection committee didn t agree. d Entremont has been a community volunteer since the day she arrived and she is very worthy to be honoured as the Citizen of the Year.
