

## Sunshine List: The top earners in Halton Hills

The salaries of public sector employees earning more than \$100,000 in Ontario were released to the public last week, which included the names of 47 staff members at the Town of Halton Hills.

There were 115,432 entries on the Sunshine List for 2015 in the province, from sectors such as school boards, municipal government, emergency services and hospitals along with environmental and charitable work.

The top earner in the Town of Halton Hills administration was outgoing CAO David Smith at \$224,871.27. He resigned in July of 2015 and was replaced by Brent Marshall, who earned just over \$190,000 last year in his dual role as CAO and Fire Chief.

The Town's Commissioner of Finance, Ed Desousa, and the Commissioner of Planning, Chris Mills, were paid \$163,280.29 each, while Director of Library Services Jane Diamanti earned \$155,505.50.

Approximately one-third of the Sunshine List names with the Town came from the Fire Department (16), headed up by Deputy Chiefs John Martin and Harry Olivieri at \$142.726.23 apiece.

Halton Healthcare Services President Denise Hardenne, who oversees Georgetown Hospital, was paid \$463,532.14.

Retiring Halton District School Board Director David Euale made \$242,056.71 in 2015, with his counterpart as head of the Catholic board, Paula Dawson, coming in at \$200,000.06.
