FIRE REPORT

Tuesday, March 1

4:33 p.m. - Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Rosemary Road in Acton. On scene, staff entered the home and using detectors, found no evidence of CO. Staff replaced the battery in the detector but the unit was still alarming. A second detector in the home had not activated and determined to be functioning normally. The homeowner was advised to vacuum the faulty detector, and should it activate again replace the unit.

Sunday, March 6

4:36 p.m.- Fire fighters responded to a two-vehicle motor vehicle collision in the area of Queen St and Tanners Drive in Acton. Ambulance was on scene upon arrival and reported no injuries or extrication required. Fire staff conducted traffic control until Halton Regional Police arrived on scene and were cleared.

Monday, March 7

2:06 p.m. - Fire fighters responded to the report of a hydro pole on fire in the area of Crewsons Line and Highway 7 in Acton. Hydro was on scene upon arrival and advised fire was not required.

At 2:15 p.m. Fire fighters responded to a carbon monoxide (CO) activation on Main St N in Acton. On scene staff checked the home for CO and no readings were found. It was determined that a power outage in the area caused the CO detector to activate.

Tuesday, March 8

2:26 p.m. - While fire fighters were in service in the community they came across an elderly resident who had fallen and had cut the right side of their face and hurt their right leg on McDonald Blvd in Acton. Staff provided patient care until ambulance arrived on scene.
