Acton Midgets take Bronze in Oshawa

The Acton House League Midget Chargers traveled to Oshawa to play in the Annual Oshawa Church League Tournament. In their first game Acton played Oshawa Harmony, coming out on top with a convincing 5-1 victory. Acton opened the scoring early, just one minute into the game, on a nice pass from Brady Borges to an open Brandon Holmes. Two goals in the second

period, both by Borges, both assisted by Jake Case. Case made it 4-0 unassisted, now 4-1, Matt Miehm finished with help from Christian Holmes and Tommy Renaud.

Game two against Stone Mills, another 5-1 victory. With Stone Mills opening the scoring early, the Chargers rallied for five of their own. Acton scored two in the first, Case from Borges and Spen-

Game three would see Acton play Oshawa Christ Church, Acton scored the first two goals, both from Borges, the first one on a great pass from Van Der Wal, the second goal from Case and Curtis Bee. Oshawa got within one before the period ended. The score would remain the same up until with just 16 seconds remained in the game and Oshawa's goalie pulled, they scored one on a deflection. Final 2-2 tie.

James Clark played amazing in stunning Oshawa more than once during the third period.

The Chargers failed to qualify for the Championship game by one goal for. Acton would now play for Bronze against Wasaga Beach. With no scoring in the first period, Acton would finally get on the board with just 1.7 seconds remaining on the clock in the second frame, on a nice individual effort from Case, assists going to Bergin and Bee. With just

under six minutes remaining Wasaga Beach tied the game. Now looking like it might head into overtime, Acton didn't want any part of that, scoring two goals just 1 minute apart, first Case on a wrap around, then Waight on a nice shot from the slot, assisted by Case and Borges.

Great tournament by all, James Clark played solid in Goal throughout the tournament, earned MVP in the Bronze game. Three wins and tie. Great job boys.
