

he egion will invest \$3.Hbillion over the next 10 years, and this year alone we will be investing over \$BH4 million to support growth in our region and ensure we can meet the needs of our communities.

Wonstruction work will soon resume throughout ffalton to help maintain our existing infrastructure in a state of good repair while implementing the egion's many planned enhancements. flor example, several road2widening projects will assist with the traffic flow on major arteries, including the widening of teeles Tvenue east of flifth ine outh to west of rafalgar oad in ffalton ffills. Tdditionally, many water and wastewater projects including the expansion of the ashburn water reservoir in Vurlington will address capacity and make routine maintenance easier.
