small quantity of cigarettes. The suspect was recorded by a video surveillance camera.

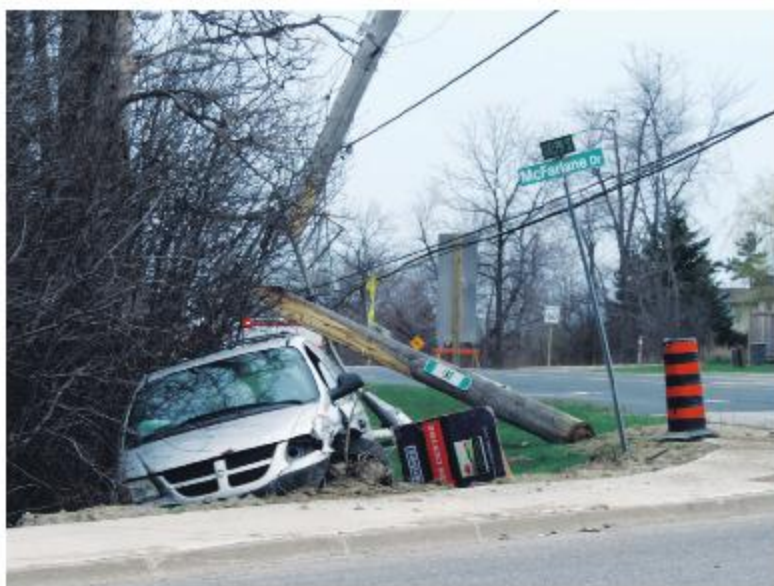
A canine unit search wasn't able to locate a suspect.

Guelph St. collision leaves residents with no power

Several hundred Halton Hills Hydro customers were left without power late Sunday afternoon after an SUV crashed into a hydro pole on Guelph St.

The incident occurred at around 5 p.m. and hydro service was interrupted in southeast Georgetown, Norval, Glen

Williams and the Armstrong Ave. industrial area.

Power was restored in most affected areas between 9-11 p.m.

Halton Regional Police reported that there were no serious injuries and no charges were laid.
