## Silver for Nurse at World Cup

The path to this summer's Olympics in Rio de Janeiro for Canada's women's eights rowing team traversed through Italy recently with a silver medal effort at the opening World Cup event of the season.

Local resident Cristy Nurse is looking to earn a spot in the Canadian boat for the Summer Olympics in Brazil later this summer, after having to serve as an alternate at the 2012 Games in England due to a lower back injury.

Canada's eights, having already qualified for the field in Rio, tuned up for their 2016 campaign by leading for much of the way at the World Rowing Cup in Varese, Italy, but were nipped at the finish line by the Nether-Page 48 ) Thursday, April 28, 2016 - The IFP - Halton Hills lands, just 0.24 seconds behind the winners time of six minutes, 22.38 seconds.

Nurse, a 29-year-old University of Ottawa law school graduate who sits second from the bow with the eights, will compete again with her Canuck teammates at the next World Cup race in Lucerne, Switzerland prior to training camps in Italy and the National Training Centre in London, Ont.

The Georgetown District High School graduate has represented Canada five times at the World Championships.

The final roster for the women's eights team for the Summer Olympics is expected to be named in late June.

Canada qualified in that event for Rio by finishing third at last year s World Championships behind the reigning title-holder U.S. and New Zealand.

# Raiders come up just short against Trenton in finals


the Dudley Hewitt Cup beginning May 3.
