

Limehouse students hold fundraiser for the Mountsberg Raptor Centre

Last Friday, the students in Ms. Caughill's grade 3 class at Limehouse Public School raised \$620 to help support the Mountsberg Raptor Rescue program. The students, who are part

of the Birds of Prey Club first learned about the Raptor Rescue program on a field trip to Mountsberg Conservation Area as part of their Social Studies class. They learned about the human impacts, and how our land uses, affect the birds

of prey and our environment. After seeing all of the amazing birds that have been rescued, and are recovering from the negative impacts of human activity, the students wanted to do something to help. As a result, they formed the Birds

of Prey Club, and then initiated and organized this fundraiser with some help from Ms. Caughill.

Through this fundraiser the Raptor Rescue offered other Limehouse students and a few invited guests a wide range of treats, treat-

ures, and bird related items in the school gym. Most items were in the 25¢ to \$3 range and included popcorn, candy, chocolate, lemonade, craft items, friendship pins, birdseed, birdhouses, and raffles for gift baskets, or family

tickets to the Mountsberg Raptor Centre. The turnout and the support for this event made it very successful. Ms. Caughill commented that "for a small school of only approximately 160 students, this is pretty great number!"
