## Town holds walking tours for Mature Neighbourhoods Study

The Town of Halton Hills initiated the Mature Neighbourhoods Character Study in March 2016 to examine whether the Town's zoning by-law is effective in maintaining the character of our mature neighbourhoods. The study responds to increased pressure for large scale home rebuilds that are sometimes referred to as monster homes.

As part of the public engagement strategy for the study, the Town is hosting a series of walking tours of local mature neighbourhoods to better understand public concerns and perspectives related to the issue. Residents are invited to join Town staff on a neighbourhood walking tour to share their input about what they value about the character of their neighbourhoods. All are welcome.
