On Camp Day June 1, Tim Hortons restaurants donate all the sales from coffee and tea sold that day to support the Tim Hortons Children's Foundation, which sends children to their camps who may not otherwise have the opportunity. Those funds raised help to pay to refurbish the camps, for the general upkeep, building any new camps as well as transportation to get the children to and from the camps.

John Malinowsky, owner of the Acton Tim Hortons, explained that as well as coffee and tea sales, customers helped to raise money by taking a turn at the prize wheel where they could win t-shirts, ornaments or other great prizes. Every spin won a prize. There were also tickets being sold for several raffle baskets being given away. Halton Hills firefighters were on hand, serving behind the counter and helping out at the drive through.

"It's fun," Malinowski said. "They (the firefighters) come here and they like doing it,

and they kind of appreciate what our staff goes through on daily basis."

Malinowsky explained that Camp Day usually sees a significant increase in the number of customers every year, noting that even people who might not usually drink coffee or prefer to buy their coffee elsewhere make a special effort to support Camp Day.

"Our customers, our guests are very gracious," Malinowsky said. "Because it is for the kids in this commu-

ity, so it's a community thing and they really step up to the plate and help out."

The Acton location had recently undergone renovations to both the interior and exterior of the restaurant. However, Malinowsky was not concerned the changes wouldn't be completed in time.

"It worked out wonderful," Malinowsky said. "This company that we had came in and said two weeks, and they were right to their word."

Working in partnership with local business Wheelbarrow Orchards, the Town has expanded the Civic Centre Demonstration Garden to include 10 apple tree saplings which are expected to produce fruit in two to three years. The fruit will also be donated to local food banks.
