Red Door Gallery re-opens at new location

Red Door Gallery re-opens this Saturday, June 25, after its move to 69 Main St. S., downtown Georgetown.

Thanks to a \$74,800 operating grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, a

preferential rate lease from Doug Pattison of Silvercreek Commercial Builders Ltd., and support from the Halton Hills Cultural Roundtable and Downtown Georgetown BIA, the gallery will build on its first year successes. Ted Arnott, MPP, with a representative of the Ontario Trillium Founda-

tion, will cut the ribbon surrounded by artists, musicians and the bustle of the farmer's market. Please join the crowd to demonstrate what amazing people we have here and to thank the OTF for investing in our community.

The opening show, A Tribute to Northern Ontario, showcases new paintings by Gordon Mitchell, winner of RDGs 2015 Juried Show. In oil and acrylic paint he captures scenes from his extensive travels in Ontario, including Muskoka, Georgian Bay, Parry Sound, and the Lake Superior region of Algoma. He paints the scene with the emotion of the experience in vivid colours and with carefree brushstrokes that capture the natural and rugged beauty of Northern Ontario. All paintings are for sale and prices start from \$295.

The new facility is larger than the gallery's first year location, and will house an Artist in Residence studio and studios for emerging artists. The Artist in Residence Shelley Newman, SCA, will mentor the emerging artists as well as create her own paintings in the studio. The emerging artists will have the opportu-

nity to develop their careers, learn gallery management skills and how to relate to the public.

The gallery's new location will also offer acoustic fundraising nights, paint nights, and a seniors art program. Multiple rooms below the gallery will house rehearsal and recording

space for young musicians, as well as storage for community non profits including Anita Bergsmas Chance to Play, and GFORCe, a grassroots non profit which gathered household inventory for settling Syrian Refugees.

We are thrilled to be reopening in such a prime location and are so grateful to Silvercreek Commercial Builders, local businesses Carpet Barn Carpet One, Dulux Paints and OldCastle BuildingEnvelope who have helped, said Kate Mc-Gowan, manager of the Red Door Gallery. Above all we could not have done it without volunteers who gave over 400 hours to get us open. It's truly humbling what people will give to enrich our town.


