# Former region manager faces charges

A former Halton manager who worked with the region for 16 years is facing fraud and municipal corruption charges.

David Atsushi Ohashi, who was manager of plant capital and engineering, had been under investigation since last year, Halton police said in a press release Wednesday.

It is alleged (Ohashi) gained personal benefit between November 2010 and January 2016 by providing confidential information and advantage to contractors that he had personal relationships with, police said.


His post allowed him to approve maintenance and construction to municipal infrastructure that was later deemed not necessary or without justification, police allege.

Ohashi also submitted altered business expense claims to the region for personal travel outside of Canada, they also allege.

Police say the fraud unit launched an investigation after receiving an anonymous tip last year. There was no sign of wrongdoing by other current or former municipal employees, the press release noted.

Ohashi, 56, of Mississauga, was dismissed from his position on Jan. 21, 2016 after the Region of Halton investigated his activities.
