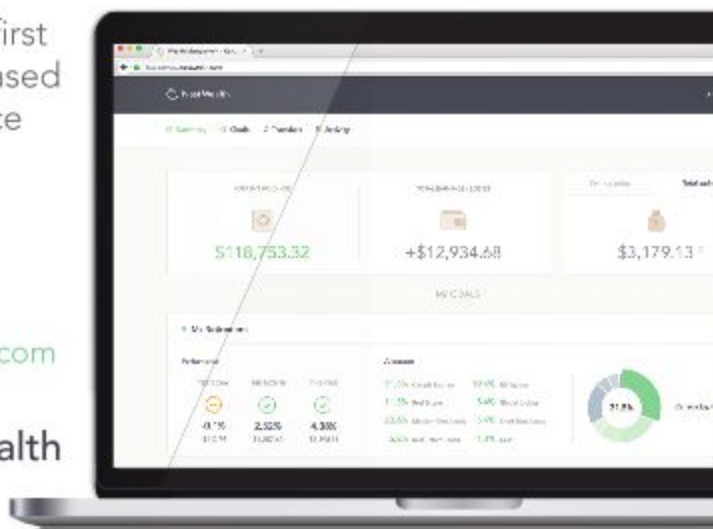

Furnace Room Brewery is coming up, out of the basement

After years of brewing and experimenting with making beer, visiting breweries here in Canada and the U.S., reading and listening to everything about beer they could find, Jeff Sandifer and Mike Glockner have gotten pretty good at brewing.

The proof of the quality of their beer comes in the form of the awards they are receiving from entering brewing competitions and the compliments from those who are lucky enough to have a pint in the backyard!

As Sandifer recalls, our wives heard us talking so much about this project, they finally said, why don't you do something about it? We don't want you looking back years from now with regret that you never actually tried to realize your dream.

With that encouragement, they determined to make their dream a reality and share their passion for making outstanding beer with their whole community.

Starting a craft brewery is a big step in terms of the time and the capital required. Partners with a full range of business skills were necessary to successfully launch a brewery.

So the pair teamed up with Trent Chalcey, Mike Dykstra and Steve Leggat who together bring the full range of technical, financial, property and construction expertise to the project.

The brewers have decided on the four core products they will start with, and also plan to have a special beer pairing for each season, with special batches for key events. They believe it is important for craft breweries to have strong ties to the community and look forward to partnering with many local



organizations and businesses in the months and years ahead.

A property has been secured, financing has been approved, equipment has been ordered, and the intrepid entrepreneurs have received enthusiastic support from everyone they have talked to.

The location of the brewery will be the building at the east end of the Go train station parking lot in Georgetown. The plan is to be producing beer by May 2017, when they look forward to giving the public tours of the brewery.

They are keen to take their concept up out of their basement breweries and into the community at the Head for the Hills craft beer festival in Georgetown on Sept. 17. Come out and meet them and learn firsthand about this exciting new addition to the community.
