# ACCESSIBILITY

The Town's Accessibility Committee will train visually impaired people to use the new Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS) at Acton's Main and Mill

Prior to Christmas, on pushbuttons on the poles.

To activate the APS, the cation signal, a tactile arrow on the pushbutton vibrates, and an audible sound is made for north/ south and east/west cross-

The Town is waiting for delivery of the pushbuttons and Roj hopes the APS system is in operating before the end of February.

Participating in municipal politics is easier for people with hearing disabilities now the Town offers assisted hearing devices for use in the Civic Centre council chambers.

Working through a wireless FM transmitter, or through a personal hearing aid, the assistive listening

devices provide amplified sound while blocking background noise.

# **Enhanced Bulk Brush Collection Services**

Due to the volume of debris to be collected following the December ice storm, Halton Region is extending its enhanced bulk brush collection services through to the end of February to assist residents with cleanup.

- Residents in areas of Halton where yard waste is regularly collected can set out one pile of unbundled bulk brush on their regular garbage collection day.
- Residents and contractors can also drop off brush debris at the Halton Waste Management Site in Milton free of charge.

Extreme weather conditions may impact storm cleanup. We ask for your patience as cleanup will take several weeks. To assist with the cleanup, residents are asked to pile branches with a maximum of 7.5 centimetres (3 inches) in diameter and 2 metres (6.5 feet) in length on their regular garbage day.

Residents are also encouraged to investigate other services being offered in their municipality to assist with storm cleanup, and brush and debris removal.

In addition to the enhanced brush collection, the three-bag garbage limit has also been lifted and will continue until January 31. Households can place up to six garbage bags without a tag for collection on their regularly scheduled day.
