

Help vulnerable residents: Mayor

In the spirit of fellowship and community following the ice storm, Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bonnette wants the public to help those without the ability to clear damaged trees from their property.

Bonnette wants community-minded organizations to participate in a clean-up event in March, when volunteers will go to homes of seniors, or other residents, who have physical limitations or who cannot

afford to hire external help. Crews will cut down tree limbs and organize debris for disposal. This effort is only for people who cannot help themselves, or cannot afford to get assistance.

The Town is committed to cleaning up the damage and debris caused by the storm as quickly as possible, and along with enhanced brush collection provided by Halton Region, it set up additional drop off op-

portunities and continues to pick up debris left on boulevards and roads.

Details of the cleanup are evolving, and Bonnette asked those interested in helping to call Nancy at 905-873-2601 ext. 2340. She is compiling a list of those who require help, and those willing to donate their times and talents to the massive cleanup, which continues on public and private land.
