ASLEEP AT THE WHEEL

A 25-year-old Acton man was charged after being found asleep behind the wheel of his 2003 Honda, which was stuck in a snow bank in the Highway 7/Guelph Line area of Rockwood.

A patrolling OPP found the Honda at 6:12 a.m. on Sunday and woke the driver who was seated behind the wheel. He showed obvious signs of impairment, and was charged with impaired and having over 80-mgs of alcohol in 100-millilitres of blood. He appears in a Guelph court on March 28.

POT STOP

OPP detected the strong odour of fresh marijuana when they pulled over a Dodge Dakota pickup truck during a R.I.D.E spot check in the Wellington Road 29 and 22 area of Guelph/Eramosa Township at 3:19 p.m. last Wednesday.

A clear plastic baggy of pot was turned over to police who charged an 18-year-old Centre Wellington man with possession of under 30-grams of marijuana. He appears in court on April 18.

DODGE AND LICENCE SEIZED

A 19-year-old Tottenham, man lost his 1998 Dodge and his driver's licence for a week after being clocked at 125 km/h in a 70 km/h zone in the Wellington Road 124/27 area of Guelph/Eramosa Township last Wednesday as 10:48 p.m.


The driver was charged with Race a Motor vehicle and appears in a Guelph court on April 16.

GET CANDIDATE WITHDRAWS

Citing "family" reasons, Rockwood's Steve Liebig has withdrawn from the race for the Ward Three seat on Guelph/Eramosa Township (GET) Council in October's municipal election.

Liebig, who lost by slim margins in the last two municipal elections for the Rockwood seat, said, "it broke my heart to pull out - it was not a decision made lightly," he said on Sunday, adding "it just wasn't the right decision for me and my family at this point." Liebig has been a volunteer Rockwood firefighter for 23 years.

Rockwood's J. Robbin Wood is the only registered candidate for the Ward Three seat being vacated by veteran incumbent Councillor Doug Breen who is running for the Ward Eight Wellington County seat, which includes GET's Wards two, three and

Veteran incumbent Councillor Gord Tosh is not seeking re-election to the Ward Eight seat. After 20 years in public life Tosh said he'd taken a job outside the community and it was difficult to get back to do

the job. GET incumbent Mayor Chris White, and incumbent Councillors David Wolk, Corey Woods and John Scott are all seeking re-election to Guelph/ Eramosa Township Council.

Incumbent County Ward Seven (including GET Ward One) Councillor Don McKay has also filed his nomination papers.

SPAGHETTI DINNER


