The spotlight in Halton will be on sexual violence awareness, education and support during May, which is Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Halton police, local politicians and members of the Halton Violence Prevention Council will mark the kickoff with a ceremony at the Halton HO.

In a press release, Halton police said by focussing on the Region's response to sexual assault and childhood sexual abuse, as well as highlighting existing services, they aim to increase awareness about the unique needs of survivors.

"Meaningful change in society will continue as long as we maintain our momentum and speak out to support survivors of sexual violence," said Kathryn Baker-Reed, executive doctor of Sexual Assault & Violence Intervention Services (SAVIS) of Halton.
