### Household Hazardous Waste



#### ✓ Acceptable materials

- acids (rust remover)
- aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- automotive liquids (antifreeze, motor oil and filters)
- batteries (household & car)
- bleach
- cosmetics & pharmaceuticals
- fluorescent lights (compact bulbs & tubes)
- fertilizers
- fuels (must leave container)
- garden chemicals
- household cleaners
- medications
- mercury containing devices
- paint (full or partially full)
- pesticides
- pool chemicals
- propane tanks & other pressurized containers
- solvents
- stains
- varsol

#### ✗ Unacceptable materials

- needles, syringes and lancets
- asbestos
- commercial and industrial hazardous waste
- PCBs
- radioactive waste
- bio-medical waste
- explosives and ammunition

#### ✓ Acceptable materials

- computers
- stereos
- phones
- TVs
- VCRs
- DVD players
- computer monitors
- printers
- cell phones
- cameras
- computer batteries

#### ✗ Unacceptable materials

- appliances
- vacuums
- scrap metal

#### ✗ Other unacceptable materials

- Commercial waste, tires, reuse materials (clothing, etc.), and scrap metal. If you are unsure whether an item will be accepted at a Special Waste Drop-off Day, contact Halton Region by dialing 311.

# May is sexual assault month

Halton police and Halton Violence Prevention council mark month

The numbers are numbing: one in two girls, and one in six boys, will experience childhood sexual abuse, and an estimated 90 per cent of all sexual

violence is not reported. The spotlight in Halton will be on sexual violence awareness, education and support during May, which is Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Halton police, local politicians and members of the Halton Violence Prevention Council will mark the kickoff with a ceremony at the Halton HQ.

In a press release, Halton police said by focussing on the Region's response to sexual assault and childhood sexual abuse, as well as highlighting existing services, they aim to increase awareness about the unique needs of survivors.

"Meaningful change in society will continue as long as we maintain our momentum and speak out to support survivors of sexual violence," said Kathryn Baker-Reed, executive director of Sexual Assault & Violence Intervention Services (SAVIS) of Halton.
