Cycling Challenge rolls - 300,000-kilometres or bust

Acton's Superior Glove is on board the Halton Hills Cycling Challenge with an unsolicited \$2,000 donation to the Georgetown Hospital Foundation fundraiser which encourages people to pedal and then record their distances at www.bikechallenge.ca

The goal this year increased by 50 per cent to 300,000-kilometres – 7.5 times around the world. At the half-way mark, \$25,000 will be donated, and when the goal is hit, sponsors will kick in a total of \$66,000 for the Georgetown Hospital Foundation.

Fresh off receipt of a Bicycle Friendly Community Award, Regional/ Ward Two Councillor Jane Fogal, chair of the Town's Trails and Cycling Advisory Committee and offshoot Bicycle Friendly Community sub-committee, officially launched the Cycling Challenge website at Council last Monday.

Fogal called the event unique - it costs nothing to participate, and people don't have to collect pledges. When the 150,000-kilometre halfway goal is reached, \$25,000 will be anted by Superior Glove (\$2,000), Georgetown Canadian Tire (\$20,000), Ollie's Cycle and Ski (\$1,000), Young Dentistry (\$1,000), Health-



Span Wellness (\$500) and Betty D'Oliveira, Johnson Associates (\$5000).

When the 300,000-kilometre goal is reached, \$41,000 has been pledged from The Peter Gilgan Foundation/Mattamy Homes (\$25,000), PwC Epic Tour Halton (\$5,000),

people don't have to collect pledges. When the 150,000-kilometre half-way goal is reached, TD Bank Group (\$5,000), CPI Canada Inc. (\$3,000) and Georgetown Chevrolet Buick GMC (\$3,000).

Fogal said signing up for the Cycling Challenge is easy, only requiring an email and a password. People who live in, work in and love Halton Hills can log their kilometres – on the honour system – all summer long. Along with the ever-changing community tally, this year there is also the option for individuals to set and then track their personal goal.

Other local cycling events this summer to mark the Town's efforts to continue as a Bicycle Friendly Community include the Epic Tour Halton at the Milton quarry in June, the third annual Ride to Work Day on May 26, and the second annual ride from the Civic Centre in Georgetown to the Acton Leathertown Festival in August.

At press time, the 194 people had logged 8,702 -kilometres.
