
A bungee cord is being used to repair part of the rail underpass at the Eramosa-Erin Town Line, also known as Crewson Corners, at the junction of Halton, Erin, Eramosa and Milton.

The damaged side straps and rails at the underpass are evident and are held on with a bungee cord. There is lots of train activity on this line, and considering the number of derailments and safety issues in the news in the past year, you would think perhaps this should be repaired. But,

whose responsibility is it? Who should be notifying the Rail company to repair it?

Last week, the rails were repaired, but only the actual tracks were done. Doesn't anyone think that the side strapping and side railing are necessary and also need to be fixed?

Also, the road right under the overpass (which we were told is Halton jurisdiction) is in a horrible state and has not been properly repaired in many years. They put a scoop of tar in the holes
