NOTICE OF STUDY COMMENCEMENT

CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT STUDY

Ninth Line (Regional Road 13) Transportation Corridor Improvements Highway 407 to 10 Side Road (Regional Road 10), Town of Halton Hills PR-2876A

Study

Halton Region is initiating a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to consider a wide range of options for transportation corridor improvements to satisfy future travel demands to 2031 on Ninth Line from Highway 407 to 10 Side Road in the Town of Halton Hills.

Process

The notice signals the commencement of the Class EA, a study which will define the problem, identify and evaluate alternative solutions, and determine a preferred solution in consultation with the Town of Halton Hills, regulatory agencies, and the public.

Public and review agency consultation is a key element of the Class EA process and input will be sought throughout this study. At this time, it is anticipated that two (2) Public Information Centres will be held.

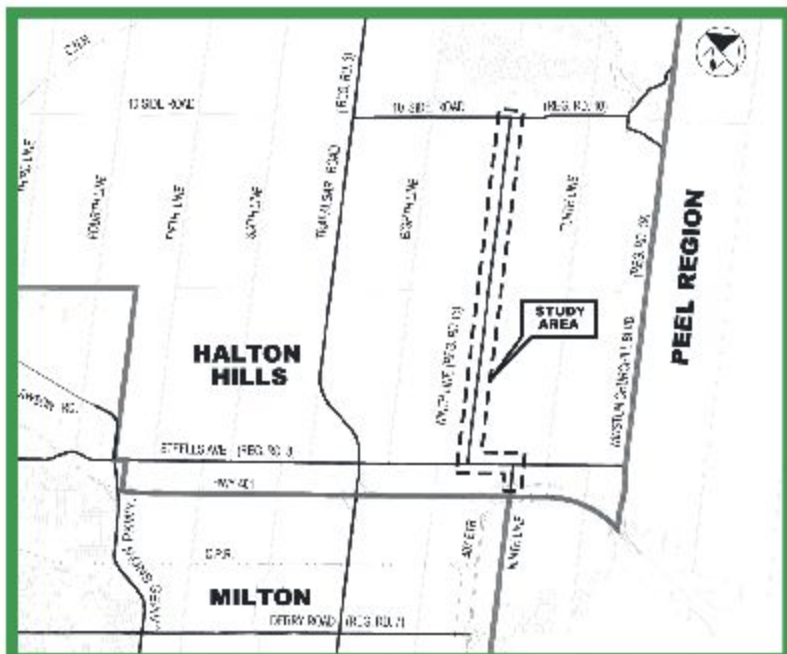

Calling all artists

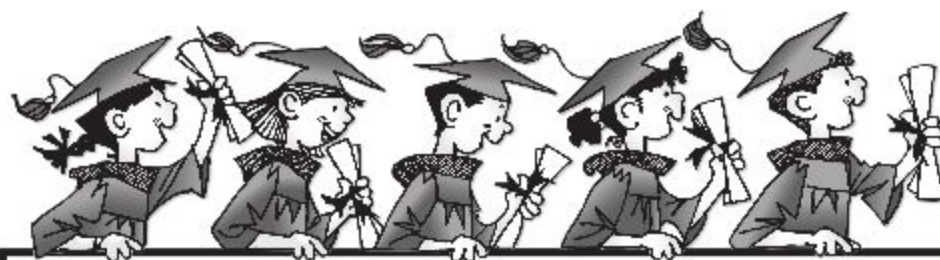
