Local priorities for MPP Arnott

riston bypass, full-day, two-way GO train service, and improved rural high speed Internet are the three key priorities for residents of newlyelected MPP Ted Arnott in Wellington-Halton Hills

"Highway 6 serves as a vital link between the 401 and the Hamilton-Niagara region and the US border," Arnott told the Legislature on Monday, adding that a Morriston bypass would

eliminate a major traffic bottleneck, improve safety and allow for the free flow of goods to the border.

Arnott also raised the

issue of full-day, twoway GO train service between Waterloo Region and the GTA, and called on the Government to bring forward details of its plan.

"During the election campaign, the Government promised full-day, two-way GO train service between Waterloo region and the GTA," he said. "What is the time- bly's Order Paper.
