## James Dick Construction Ltd. pleased with progress of Hidden Quarry Review

The Hidden Quarry proposal located on Highway 7 and the 6th Line, just east of Rockwood received an Application Status Report at a special council meeting held on August 12, 2014 at the Rockmosa Centre.

The audience heard that, while the review of the application is still underway, many of the review agencies have signed off on the project or have no further concerns.

"We are really pleased to get signoffs from MNR, MOE, MTO the Ministry of Culture, The Grand River Conservation Authority and others, " said Greg Sweetnam, spokesman for the company. "These are tough agencies to satisfy and the public should take a level of comfort from the fact that these experts have been satisfied."

The township's process involves the applicant preparing a series of expert consultant reports according to Township policies. These reports are subsequently reviewed by experts on staff at the various public agencies, as well as an expert panel of Peer Review consultants hired by the Township and paid for by the applicant.

"So far the Peer Review has been tough but fair, although it always seems to take longer than one would expect", said Sweetnam. While some areas such as Noise, Dust and the Natural Environment have been signed off by the Peer Reviewers, the final reports are expected in other areas over the coming months. "Once the experts have weighed in we can refocus our efforts on dealing with concerns raised by individual members of the public."

Scott Merritt, Carl Wilson Appear at 'Taste and Transmission'


