

### Rockwood author determined to reduce The Wait for mental health treatment

In 2012, Rockwood resident Kellie Joyce participated in the Mental Health Commission of Canada's Knowledge Exchange Centre inaugural SPARK Training Institute. When asked to create a project to "promote change and help stop the shame and stigma surrounding mental health", Joyce decided to write a memoir chronicling her experiences with mental illness and the struggle to receive medical treatment. Two years in the making, The Wait is now available.

A gut-wrenching story starting with the sexual abuse she endured as a child at the hands of her father, this is a gripping book, easily read in one day if not for the emotion-

ally challenging subject. I was going to go with a Titled after the agonizingly long, and sometimes fatal wait Canadians with mental illness face for

medical treatment, Joyce nevertheless inspires her readers with determination and optimism for a brighter future.

The determination that saw Joyce through a trial against her father, life

with a new family, and becoming the support person for a family member with bipolar saw her through the publishing process as well. "The publishing part was a lot harder than the writing part. At first

sick of waiting again, to have someone say it's good enough to publish, so I said okay, I'm going to do it myself"". explained Joyce.

Joyce's description of figuring out

how to self-publish a book could equally be used to describe the process to receive mental health treatment. "If I didn't get all the help I had I would never have been able to do it. I researched it all.

That was the worst part, it was really time consuming, and there were a lot of details. There was a lot of red tape to go through. And then the cost, I tried to do it so I didn't have any costs because, I didn't have any money".

Joyce, who emphasizes the 'joy' of her last name, made her way through the publishing red tape, and has been thrilled with support she has received from the Rockwood community.

The Wait is available for purchase in at The Roxy and Country Reflections, and in Rockwood at River's Edge Gift Shop, Rockwood Pharmacy, Whistle Stop, and Foodland. "Almost everywhere in Rockwood sells it", she says. "My community has really supported me."

The Dr. John Dougan Centre of Acton has chosen Joyce to speak at a free event they are hosting next Thursday, October 9 at the historic Acton Town Hall, as part of Mental Illness Awareness Week. Following Joyce's talk, there will be a question and answer period, refreshments, the opportunity to purchase The Wait and a book signing. Doors open at 7 p.m.

Friday: Firefighters were at RBC promoting the food drive from 11am-2pm


Saturday: RBC and Firefighters (with truck) were at Foodland for BBQ and food collection 11am-2pm


