The Hidden Quarry in Wellington-Eramosa is going to be a huge issue for the Acton area. Our roads could be the major haul route for dump trucks. We have to oppose this application as it stands today. Council has already deemed this application as premature. We need Hydrological studies on the water table as well as a haul route which will not impact roads in and around Acton. There is a lot of work to do on that one. We do have a truck strategy with short and long term objectives that must be followed through such as asking the Province for a weigh station to be sure these haulers have safe vehicles.

The exciting arena project is well underway but the Three Mustektears Skateboard Action Park must be designed and be


