Borges gave Acton the lead once more with an assist from

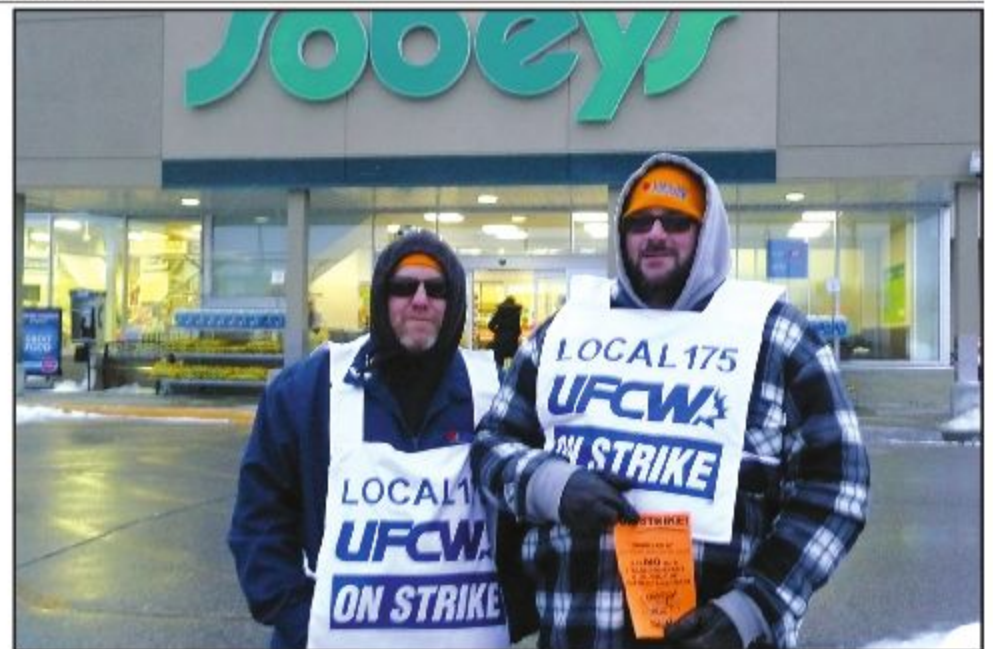
Jack Timmerman, but less than a minute later Cambridge tied it up to end the game 4-4.

On Sunday, February 24, Acton hosted Waterloo. Our 4-1 loss did not reflect how the team played. The Chargers played hard and Ethan Krusky turned away a barrage of shots at his net, to keep the score to only down one nothing by mid game. Late in the second period, MacPherson scored on a breakaway to tie it up, only to have Waterloo score two goals in eight seconds. Acton never gave up and only let in one more goal in the third period.

This was an aggressively played game both defensively and offensively with Josh Dunbar and Ethan Krusky showing quality skills in net in both games.

This past Sunday, Acton travelled to Waterloo to again face the Wolves. Acton played a great first period: down 1-0, then early in the second frame, got a power play goal on a nice shot, top corner by Jake Case, assists going to Borges and McPherson.
