

Atom AE Tanners one win from OMHA finals

The Acton Tanners Atom AE team came out on the right side of two barn burner OMHA quarterfinal games two weeks ago with Midland to take the series 3-1 and advance to the OMHA semi-finals. Then, a long trip to Huntsville resulted in two hard fought victories to earn them four points in the six point series to get within just two points of a trip to the finals.
