NO CULTURAL COMMONS

Town councillors rejected the concept of a "larger scale significant place that acts as a cultural commons" by a show of hands at a recent briefing on progress developing a Cultural Master Plan.

The Town's consultants suggested locating a cultural commons in a former gravel pit at Silver Creek, not a good plan according to Regional Ward Two Councilor Jane Fogal who said they should put more effort into communicating about cultural events in the town and forget about expanding Hghway 7. "For me, the way to get from Georgetown to Acton using culture as my background, I'd go through the rural area, right through Limehouse," Fogal said, adding she try to make the linkages through the rural area and create hubs in the downtowns.

Council will deal with the final draft of the Cultural Master Plan on June 10. Several councillors asked that the final version of the list of heritage features includes the Acton and Georgetown Fall Fairs, the historic lime kilns in Limehouse, and the scenic trail potential of the Glen Lawson Road area.
