### Sale of Geo-Foundations means growth for Acton firm

Acton's Geo-Foundations Contractors has been sold, but is not moving to Mississauga as rumoured. The Main Street North firm – specialists in ground modification systems – continues with founder Todd Edmunds as President of the company which is now a subsidiary of Hayward Baker Canada, owned by Keller Foundations of England.

"They came courting," Todd Edmunds said of the long process that led to the deal. His said on Tuesday the biggest change for Acton will be expansion to increase the current \$20-million annually in revenue. "We have a mandate to double the




business within five years. The challenge will be finding people, not work," Edmunds said they need qualified field labourers and drillers.

Edmunds doesn't expect he new owner to "tamper" with local successes, and will allow the Acton office a "little more freedom to develop a business."

Geo-Foundations' website said it provides a full range of ground engineering technologies applicable to geotechnical construction, with particular focus on solutions related to earth retention, foundation support, ground improvement, and ground treatment. There are 80 employees in Acton.
