Public board approves budgets

Trustees with the Halton District School Board have approved the operating and capital budgets for the 2013-14 school year. Both budgets are compliant with the province's Public Sector Accountability Board (PSAB) requirements.

The 2013-14 operating budget for the Halton District School Board totals \$632,518,641, while the capital budget totals \$59,805,368.

"With this budget, we are building on the investments and the Board's operational objectives established in the Multi-Year Plan," said Lucy Veerman, Superintendent

of Business and Treasurer for the Halton District School Board in a press release, adding, "we were able to work within some challenging financial parameters, and bring in a balanced budget for both operating and capital needs for 2013-

The budget reflects an on-going commitment to student achievement and continual improvement of Board programs and services for every student. Recognizing the three goal areas of the Halton District School Board's Multi-Year Plan – Students, Staff, and System – the budget reflects the needs of a growing

> In 2013-14, the Halton District School Board will welcome approximately 59,500 students in 82 elementary and 18 secondary schools. This enrolment projection results in an overall increase of 4.4 per cent compared to the 2012-13 school year. This projected growth in enrolment has also resulted in additional staff (296.1 full-time equivalents from the 2012-13 budget), in order to meet class size legislation and/or program requirements.

> "The 2013-14 budget demonstrates our com

mitment to manage the issues that have resulted from a growing system, and to provide for continual support for student achievement and program initiatives," said David Euale, Director of Education. "This budget will help support initiatives arising from our Multi-Year Plan, and help us frame our annual Operational Plans in order to continue to meet - and exceed expectations for our students and our communities."
