## Extra bulk brush pickup after storm

Halton's yard waste collection trucks will work overtime to handle after-storm cleanup efforts. Halton's enhanced bulk brush collection gives residents with regular yard waste service until August 10 to put out one pile of unbundled bulk brush on their usual vard waste collection day. Due to the August 1 Civic Holiday, for Acton residents the additional brush pickup service is available on Thursday, August 8.

"Halton Region works

hard to ensure we are prepared to respond in the event of an emergency," said Regional Chair Gary Carr in a press release issued Tuesday. "Waste collection is an important service we offer, so we are working with our partners at the City of Burlington and the Towns of Halton Hills, Milton and Oakville to help residents manage the clean-up of the additional bulk brush caused by the storm."

Tree trunks are not accepted as bulk brush. Dial 311 for instructions regarding brush larger than three inches in diameter.

Bulk brush includes loose twigs and branches which must be free of loose leaves and trimmings, and does not need to be bundled or tied.

Regular Yard Waste materials including yard and garden trimmings, loose

leaves, sticks and twigs, tree trimmings and fallen fruit from trees can also be set out. These materials should be placed in paper yard waste bags or open, reusable, rigid containers labelled yard waste. Containers may have a capacity up to 125 L (27 imperial gallons) and weigh no more than
