One woman gave control of her computer to the caller before becoming concerned and hanging up, and Wellington OPP offer protection tips:

- · Don't accept anything at face value, if it sounds unlikely or too good, it
- · Recognize the signs, if

you're being pressured to act, disclose personal details or send money to a stranger, it's almost certainly a scam.

- Never respond. Just hang up the phone and report the incident to the O.P.P. and the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at www. antifraudcentre.ca
- Act quickly call O.P.P. at 1-888-310-1122, and the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre at 1-888-495-8501, to stop scammers in their tracks.
