Eden Mills church celebrates 150 years

Church will celebrate its 150th Anniversary on Sunday, July 17 at the small stone church nestled deep in the Village, over looking the Eramosa River. The guest speaker will be United Church of Canada Moderator, Mardi Tindal, and outspoken advocate for action to address climate change.

The work of "soul, community, creation" will converge in Eden Mills where Moderator Tindal's passion for the environment is shared by members of the community and church. Eden Mills Going Carbon Neutral, a project of Eden Mills Millpond Conservation Association Inc., has been very successful in reducing the carbon footprint of the village since 2007 when Eden Mills set its goal to be the first

Eden Mills United village in North America to "Go Carbon Neutral." www.goingcarbonneutral.


