bers - Durham, Halton, Peel and York Regions, Toronto, the federal and provincial governments and GTA Federations of Agriculture - will run out next year.

Horner detailed some of the work done on the A.A.C.'s 37-point action plan with its three main themes - economic development, education/ marketing and land-use policy. She said a major accomplishment is that GTA municipalities, planners and economic development officials are now working together to ensure issues are dealt with in a consistent man-

Red Light cameras return

In an effort to modify bad and dangerous driver behaviour, Halton will reintroduce a red light camera enforcement program, which, at least initially, won't include any Acton locations.

Éleven years ago, Halton was part of provincial pilot project to determine if red light cameras improved safety at locations with high incidents of right-angle collisions caused by red light running. Halton participated for two years, but dropped out due to low numbers of violations. Now, Regional staff is convinced that red light cameras reduce rightangle collisions, improve driver compliance with traffic signals, reduces the severity of collisions and

injuries and reduces costs for emergency services, health care and insurance claims.

At its meeting yesterday (Wednesday) Halton Council was expected to ratify a committee vote to resume participation in the program, initially with one camera in Burlington and one in Oakville this year. Over the next three years, 12 intersections will be outfitted with the cameras, which will relay data about violators to a joint process centre in To-

The annual cost to run the program is \$83,000 per location - that's \$215,000 for the initial two sites to the end of next year. The fine for running a red is \$265 with a \$50 victim surcharge.



Swastika graffiti investigated

The timing, symbols and colours of graffiti left at five Acton locations overnight Monday lead Halton police to suspect the vandalism incidents are related.

Swastikas were spray-painted at two locations - Acton High School and on three stop signs in the Third Line/32 Side Road area. Gold spray paint was used to deface the front of the off The Wall youth centre on Mill Street, and on the rear window and door at the Town Hall Centre on Willow Street.

"We're concerned with any type of graffiti but any time someone is out there putting up swastikas, it causes us even more concern," said Detective Sergeant Murray Drinkwalter on Wednesday.
