

## Township pay hike

Under a new pay scale bylaw approved last week, Guelph Eramosa Township councillors will receive a 2.5% raise this year, the same amount given to nonunion employees.

The remuneration bylaw passed last week pegs the mayor's salary at \$14,720. The 3.5 per cent increase means a salary of \$9,813 for councillors. One-third of the remuneration is for expenses, incidental to the discharge of a councillor's duties.

In addition to the remuneration, councillors received \$75 for each meeting beyond regular council meetings, a per diem rate of \$110 for all council members for meals and attendance at conferences, work shops, or legal trials, reimbursement for registration, accommodation and travel, and costs to attend conferences or workshops. As well, the mayor will receive a \$500 annual mileage allowance.

## Fire stats

Medical calls made up over half of all of the calls answered by Guelph/Eramosa Township firefighters in May. The latest statistics show that of the 22 calls, 14 were of a medical nature. There were also three false alarms, two grass/brush fires, and single calls for public assistance, a burn complaint, and a motor vehicle accident.

# Build it and ....

Great financial news for the \$6.2-million Royal Distributing Athletic Performance Centre in Marden. Guelph/ Eramosa Township's manager of Finance Linda Cheyne reported recently that daily use and overall interest in the new facility exceeds initial estimates. She said in

the first quarter of the year, more than 50 per cent of the total revenue forecast has been realized with bookings.

Located in Marden Park, two kilometres west of Highway 6 in Guelph/ Eramosa Township, the state-of-the-art facility - two-thirds financed by the Federal and Provincial governments - houses a world class artificial turf sports field, a rubberized track, office space, coaching/ learning room, outdoor multi-purpose fields, and outdoor fully lit, CFL-size football field, outdoor sports fields, picnic areas, community centre, and County library.

# Rockwood roads

Almost half of the \$235,140 budgeted to resurface Rockwood roads this summer will be spent for hot mix asphalt. Guelph/Eramosa Township Council accepted a tender from Cox Construction for \$117,140 to supply hot mix asphalt to resurface Pasmore, Balaclava, Inkerman, Clara, George, Price, Pine and the interior roadway at Lloyd Dyer Park. The remainder of the budget will be spent on gravel, catch basin improvements, cross culverts, painting and minimal curb and sidewalk work.

Council also approved a \$313,915 bid from Cox Construction to supply the asphalt to resurface sections of Paisley Road and the Milton-Eramosa Townline. Milton will be invoiced \$125,000 for share of the job.

As well, the Township approved a \$290,878 tender from Drexler Construction, to cross the Eramosa River to replace the water main and sanitary sewer under Main Street.
