Minister delays GTA West Corridor route

In what is a major victory for Halton Hills, the Minister of Transportation announced finalization of the GTA West Corridor – which could cut a wide swath across southern Halton Hills – is on hold for further public consultation and study.

In an August 5 letter to Halton Hills Mayor Rick Bon-

nette, the Minister said finalization of the transportation strategy will be delayed until at least the spring of 2012 to allow the Ministry to do additional analysis and consultation, rather than adopting a blend of so-called alternatives 4-2 and 4-3 as the Ministry's draft strategy had recommended.

"This is good news because the Minister is essentially saying that the Ministry will further examine the Town's proposal which was Alternative 4-2 and the widening of the 401 to an urban standard through Halton Hills and Milton rather than to a rural standard," Mayor Bonnette said in a press release issued on Wednesday.
