Don't fall for a computer repair scam

Have you ever received a phone call warning you of a virus on your computer? Some callers posing as workers from Microsoft or other internet providers are attempting to trick people into handing over access to their computers and personal information.

The County of Wellington OPP have received complaints that scammers have phoned their potential victims and claimed that a problem, such as a serious virus infection, has been detected on their computer. The caller will instruct the home owner they must immediately follow the caller's instructions in order to fix this problem. Police warns that those who comply with the scam caller's instructions will in fact be giving criminals access to their computer and any personal files stored on it.

This is a real scam operation that has

been targeting residents across North America for several months. Callers attempt to trick those they call into going to their computers and opening a website, ostensibly as part of the procedure for fixing the supposed virus. However, once on this website, they will be tricked into downloading and installing trojans and other malware that can allow criminals access to the compromised computer and harvest personal and financial information. The victim may also be tricked into parting with credit card details, in order to purchase software supposedly needed to "fix" the computer problem.

Wellington OPP remind computer owners to exercise caution when dealing with anyone over the phone. Deal with companies known to you, and when in doubt, check with the Better Business Bureau for references.
