Tax rate ratings

Township Digest

Halton Hills holds a top 20 spot on the list of property tax rates in 26 GTA municipalities this year – at 0.97 per cent for residential, and 1.9 per cent for multi-residential – the Town is 18th on the list of residential tax rates.

A recent finance staff report to Town councillors showed property tax rates have declined overall from last year, and Toronto has the lowest rate in the GTA. The highest tax rates are in the Durham Region municipalities of Oshawa, Brock, Clarington, Whitby and Ajax.

The "novae res urbis" report said a notable shift is Burlington's rise to the 16th highest residential rate from 19th last year, and neighbouring Caledon rose from being the fourth lowest to the 20th.





A Hornby gas station attendant is in stable condition in hospital with severe lacerations and wounds received during an armed robbery on Monday night at the Hornby Pump Gas Bar.

Police said a lone suspect demanded cash and the employee was injured during a scuffle. He was able to call 911. A K9 team was called in and the search continues for the suspect, described as male, Caucasian, who wore a disguise, and was possibly armed with what police called an "edged weapon."

Cyber scam

Halton police urge people to be vigilant about protecting their online information after an Acton real estate agent was the target of a cyber scam for money. The agent, who does not want to be identified, learned of the scam on Tuesday morning when friends and family began calling to say they had received an e-mail, purportedly from the agent – saying she was attacked and robbed while on vacation in Scotland and needed money.

The fraudulent e-mail was sent to at least 500 people, and the scammers hacked the victim's e-mail account and delete her entire contact list.

Smoldering fire

Acton firefighters helped extinguish a leftover backyard fire at 8:35 on

Sunday morning after a complaint about open air burning on Churchill Road South. The fire had been burned the previous evening and was still smoldering the next morning.

False alarm
