and a blog site (www. haltonrecycles.ca).

Residents have long been enthusiastic participants in Halton's waste management and 3Rs (reduce, reuse, recycle) programs and eager to learn about related environmental information. The new social media tools will make it possible to continue the conversation with residents in a timely, web-based manner.

"Thanks to residents' ongoing support of the GreenCart program and the Blue Box recycling program, we have been

able to divert 60 per GreenCart. Residents will cent of waste away from Halton's landfill site," said Gary Carr, Halton's Regional Chair. "These new online communities will provide another avenue for residents to talk with staff and discuss all aspects of waste management, to encourage even more participation and ultimately more diversion."

Halton's Waste Management experts will be available on weekdays on both sites to share information and engage with Halton residents who want to learn more about topics including waste diversion events and contests, environmental 311 or toll free 1-866trends, waste collection 442-5866. Information notices, household waste diversion tips and how to correctly sort items into the Blue Box and
