### Arnott's support

Like the rest of Wellington-Halton Hills, voters in Acton were solidly behind incumbent MPP Ted Arnott who was handily returned to office earlier this month with 56 per cent of the vote.

A poll-by-poll breakdown shows that Arnott won all but one poll, located at the Legion in

Acton. It went to Liberal candidate Moya Johnson, who garnered 43 votes at that poll compared with 38 for Arnott who consistently out-pollled NDP candidate Dale Hamilton who ran third with 21 and seven for the Green candidate, Dartsch.

Hamilton won more votes than Johnson in six Acton polls, and in her home

of Eden Mills, Hamilton garnered the most votes at one poll, but ran third to Arnott and Johnson on the second Eden Mills poll.

The results from the Provincial returning Officer in Electoral District 99, showed Arnott also handily took all of the polls in Hillsburgh, Rockwood, Limehouse and Ballinafad.

# 'Rolling Recognition' for Georgetown Hospital
