

share their many talents. "Give of your time as you settle into the community which will become your own. Embrace life-long learning and bend to change as it presents itself," White said, adding that change, challenge and the unexpected are all opportunities for growth.

Along with the academic achievements, White said members of the graduating class helped raise \$1,500 for the Terry Fox Run, \$8,500 for a Me2We African school and water project, and the most per capital of any Ontario school for an Inside Ride cancer fundraiser. Members of the graduating class also contributed 9,220 community honours more than double the amount required by each student who must donate 40 hours of volunteer time to graduate.

In her valedictory address, Chelsea Benham, who earned the Principal's Award for Student Leadership, the Emyrs Jenkins Ministerial Bursary, and was named an Ontario Scholar, praised their "incredible" teachers. Benham challenged her fellow grads to remember the teacher, or teachers, who made an impact on their education. "This is a rare gift that we graduates must recognize and remember," Benham said, adding they were taught to never forget that people matter.

"We graduate tonight, not only with an education that we have earned, but also received. I hope above all else, you leave here tonight knowing that you are not alone in this journey," Benham said, adding, "it only gets better from here."
