Conquer inflammation with Serrapeptase

Inflammation is the number one reason that an individual consults any health care practitioner. Arthritis, gastritis, colitis, dermatitis, nephritis, neuritis and cystitis are just some of the common inflammatory conditions that bring people to their doctors every day.

Inflammation is now considered to be a more important risk factor for heart disease than high cholesterol levels. 
