## Town waives fees for Heritage Acton at the Town Hall Centre

Heritage Acton will not have to pay \$12,622 in development charges to the Town for its expansion plans at the Acton Town Hall Centre. Town Council waived the fees at Monday's council meeting following a request from Heritage Acton, which is constructing an elevator, adding storage, ground-level access and a Citizens' Hall to the heritage building.

The Town's policy allows it to waive development charge fees to charitable, non- and not-for-profit organizations that meet certain criteria. The school board does not have a fee waiver policy and neither does Halton Region, but on behalf of Heritage Acton, the Town will ask Halton to approve a grant in lieu of Regional development charges, which would save Heritage Acton an additional \$26,000.

# Police Report

## Nassagaweya accident

Two people suffered series injuries, one had minor injuries and another walked away from a two-vehicle collision Monday night on Second Line Nassagaweya, at the 15 Side Road intersection.

Halton police are looking for witnesses to the 6 p.m. crash that involved a westbound Silverado truck and a northbound Ford, both which ended up in the ditch, the Ford on its roof. The pickup driver, a 63-year-old Moffat man was not hurt, and a 23-year-old Guelph woman in the Ford was treated for minor injuries and released from Milton hospital.

Two passengers in the Ford were seriously hurt. A man from Guelph was taken to Guelph hospital

and later transferred to Toronto. A second Guelph man was airlifted from Milton hospital to Hamilton General, where he was listed in serious but stable condition.

The intersection was closed for six hours during

the investigation. Police would not comment on potential charges, but ruled out alcohol as a factor in the accident. No names were released.

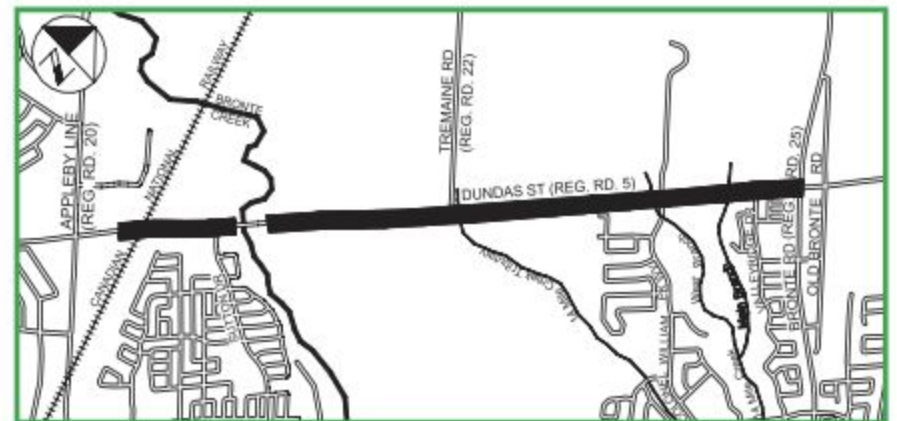
