Town waives fees for Heritage Acton at the Town Hall Centre

Heritage Acton will not have to pay \$12,622 in development charges to the Town for its expansion plans at the Acton Town Hall Centre. Town Council waived the fees at Monday's council meeting following a request from Heritage Acton, which is constructing an elevator, adding storage, ground-level access and a Citizens' Hall to the heritage building.

The Town's policy allows it to waive development charge fees to charitable, non- and notfor-profit organizations that meet certain criteria. The school board does not have a fee waiver policy and neither does Halton Region, but on behalf of Heritage Acton, the Town will ask Halton to approve a grant in lieu of Regional development charges, which would save Heritage Acton an additional \$26,000.


