



Eden debate delayed

Delays in signing legal documents to swap part of a parking lot for a sidewalk at the Eden Mills Community Hall preempted Guelph/Eramosa Township Council's scheduled Monday night debate and vote on the ambitious energy retrofit plans at the Hall, which is co-owned by the municipality and the Eden Mills Community Club.

Some village residents are unhappy with plans to install two large solar panels on Main Street at the Hall, and Council must decide if it supports the proposal. Guelph/ Eramosa Township Mayor Chris White, who noted he

may have postponed the debate anyway because two councillors were absent, said the majority of councillors appear to support the plan to retrofit the Hall, with help of \$170,000 in grants. Council will debate the issue at its December 19 meeting.

Wellington 101

Wellington County's "road show" visited the Guelph/Eramosa council chambers on Monday night as top County staff put faces to their names for Township councillors and staff. Guelph/Eramosa Mayor Chris White, who is also Wellington's Warden, said the County plays a "significant" role in Townships' operations, and sometimes the upper and lower tier don't cross

Wellington CAO Scott Wilson described the County as a "cradleto-grave" operation with an annual budget of approximately \$165-million - \$75-million of that from taxes. Joking that he's the "weak link" at the County, Wilson introduced the County's top staff who each gave a quick sketch of their job. Wilson said he was "proud" to work with them all. "(Wellington) is very well served in everyone one of those service areas -I don't think you could find any staff in the province better dedicated to the profession..."
