## Young woman dead following single-vehicle crash on Sixth Line

A 19-year-old Milton woman was killed in a single-vehicle accident near the Milton-Halton Hills border last Friday afternoon.

The crash occurred shortly after 1 p.m. on Sixth Line, north of Steeles Ave. A 2001 Nissan Sentra was traveling northbound on Sixth Line when it left the roadway to the east and landed on its roof.

The passenger was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver a 25-year-old Halton Hills man sustained minor injuries and was taken to Milton District Hospital as a precaution and released.

The deceased s name will not be released at this time, Halton police said.

Sixth Line between Steeles and No. 5 Sideroad was closed for several hours for the investigation.

The cause of the crash is still under investigation. Halton police's Collision Reconstruction Unit was on scene.

The Town's Economic Development section has been revamped on its website, which allows information to be searched in a more streamlined manner and makes it easier for prospective businesses to work with the Town.


